

 - (a) short term/crisis/transitional accommodation;

 - (c) case management.
2. Aged Care – residential aged care and case management in Mission Australia owned facilities;

 - (f) delivery of mental health services;
 - (g) legal and court support, offender support and post-release/re-integration and youth diversion; or
 - (h) financial wellbeing services including emergency relief/material aid, financial counselling, gambling support.
 - (i) drug and alcohol education programs
7. Employment, education and training services, including but not limited to:
 - (a) resume writing;
 - (b) early childhood education; or
 - (c) learner-driver program.
8. Food/catering services – provision of food in residential services, food preparation and staff training in café vans/food trucks;
9. National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) programs – NDIS local area coordination and NDIS early childhood;
10. Nursing services – in services such as Aged Care and residential detox, residential rehab and some homelessness services; or
11. Property management – of Social Housing (under various contracts with government).
