<b>HOME OWNERSHIP</b> with/without support	Mortgage assistance products and subsidies	First Home Buyer schemes, shared equity schemes
<b>PRIVATE MARKET rental housing</b> with/without support	Private rental housing products with no support	Commonwealth Rent Assistance (CRA); state-based rental subsidies such as Rent Choice Start Safely (NSW); bond loan programs
	Private rental housing with low/medium/high support*	SHS/tenancy support services <b>MA example:</b> Northern Sydney Homelessness Support Service
Long-term below-market rented housing, ie <b>AFFORDABLE AND SOCIAL HOUSING</b> , with/without support	Affordable housing products with no support	CRA; former NRAS program; HIF; HAFF <b>MA example:</b> Affordable housing proposed for HIF (Qld)
	Affordable housing with low/medium/high support*	<b>MA examples:</b> affordable housing at Midtown plus Tailored Support Coordination Service (TSCS) (NSW)
	Social housing with no support	<b>MA example:</b> social housing in Tas, Coffs Harbour, Sydney, etc
	Social housing with low/medium/high support*	<b>MA examples:</b> social housing at Midtown plus TSCS (NSW); THRIVE (WA); Housing and Accommodation Support Initiative (NSW).
<b>PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING</b> long-term housing with ongoing high-level 24/7 support	Housing with very high support - adults general*	<b>MA example:</b> Common Ground (NSW)
	Housing with very high support - aged care*	<b>MA examples:</b> Benjamin Short Grove; Annie Green Court; Charles Chambers Court (NSW)
	Housing with very high support – disability*	<b>MA example:</b> Frankston resi disability facility (Vic)
	Housing with support - children or young people who are not able to sustain independent living*	<b>MA example:</b> Youth Foyer (QLD); Duke St (NSW)

<b>UNIVERSAL PREVENTION MEASURES:</b> Preventing or minimising structural risks of homelessness across the population at large	Poverty alleviation	Income support increases; minimum wage increases; cash transfers
	High rates of secure employment	Labour market programs <b>MA examples:</b> Transition to Work, Disability Employment Services
	Violence (esp DFV) prevention	<b>MA example:</b> Men's Behaviour Change Programs (NSW)
	Closing The Gap, elimination of systemic racism	Consumer protection measures for racism in real estate industry
	Adequate and affordable childcare	<b>MA example:</b> Early Learning (Miller and Rossmore) (NSW)
	Family restoration, relationship/parenting support	<b>MA example:</b> Family Preservation Program (NSW)
	Community and service connections	<b>MA example:</b> Tenant Participation Community Engagement (NSW)
	Youth support	<b>MA example:</b> Targeted Early Intervention (NSW)
<b>TARGETED PREVENTION:</b> Early-stage prevention programs focussed on high-risk-of-homelessness groups	Adequate and affordable health, mental health and AOD programs	<b>MA examples:</b> Drug and Alcohol Youth Outreach Service (SA); Mental Health Support Service (Meekatharra WA)
	Responses for young people at risk of homelessness and educational disengagement	In-school screening programs (eg COSS), other tailored programs <b>MA example:</b> Flexible Learning Options (SA)
	Responses to prevent young people leaving out-of-home care from exiting into homelessness	<b>MA example:</b> Better Futures (Vic)
	Responses to prevent people leaving justice facilities into homelessness	<b>MA example:</b> Youth Justice Casework Support Program (NSW)
	Responses to prevent people leaving health, mental health, AOD facilities from exiting into homelessness	Clarendon Homeless Outreach Psychiatric Service (CHOPS) (Vic); Assessment, Liaison, & Early Referral Team (ALERT) (Vic)
<b>IMMINENT PREVENTION:</b> Responses that prevent entry to housing crisis/homelessness for people at foreseeable or imminent risk of homelessness	Culturally appropriate short stay accommodation for First Nations people travelling to regional centres	<b>MA example:</b> Batten Road (NT)
	DFV support	<b>MA example:</b> Staying Home, Leaving Violence (NSW)
	Family restoration	<b>MA example:</b> Reconnect (national)
	Tenancy support/evictions prevention	<b>MA example:</b> Early Intervention Tenancy Support Service (NSW)
	Short-term support for those newly homeless to re-enter the private rental market and social housing	<b>MA example:</b> Divert program (SA)

<b>CRISIS/TRANSITIONAL accommodation</b>	General adult crisis and transitional accommodation*	<b>MA example:</b> Mission Australia Centre Surry Hills (NSW)
	Crisis and transitional accommodation for women*	<b>MA example:</b> Yaralla Cottages (NSW)
	DFV shelters*	<b>MA examples:</b> Women's Safe House Walgett (NSW); Gununa Bidngen Nyerrwe, Mornington Island (Qld)
	Youth rapid rehousing*	<b>MA example:</b> Reset4Youth (NSW)
	Youth refuges*	<b>MA examples:</b> YASS Perth (WA); Eastern Murrumbidgee Youth Service Wagga (NSW)
	Crisis/transitional accommodation for people sleeping rough*	<b>MA examples:</b> Roma House (QLD); Douglas House (QLD)
	Crisis/transitional accommodation for people with severe and persistent mental illness*	Transitional Housing Team (Qld)
